

13.	Court challenges	A prime mover is Shannon Liss-Riordan, a Boston attorney who has pursued multiple cases against gig economy companies. In Europe Uber drivers sued - mostly unsuccessfully - in Dutch courts for information about algorithms allocating their work and pay. A 2020 case in Canada ruled some controls Uber imposed on workers were illegal. The company has over years managed to uphold a US ban on class actions by drivers but was then swamped by activists filing individual arbitration claims around a seperate issue.
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
